Objectives:

The West Coast Optimization Meeting meets once a year at the Univ. Washington. It brings together the optimization community in the Pacific Northwest (faculty and students from UW, WSU, UBC, SFU, UVic and practitioners from industry such as Boeing and Microsoft) and outside visitors for 2 days of seminars and informal meetings to share and exchange ideas on recent developments and future directions in optimization.

Comments:

The West Coast Optimization Meeting has been ongoing for more than 20 years. It is the only regularly held optimization meeting west of Chicago. For most of that time, it is a 1-day meeting, held twice a year, once at Univ. Washington and once at UBC or SFU. For various reasons, the meeting is being held once a year since 2005. Accordingly, we would like to expand it to 2 days (at least for 2007) to accomodate more speakers and invited visitors, broaden the scope, and provide more time for interaction.

This will be benefit students by broadening/deepening their exposure to ongoing research. 2007 is timely since there will be no other regional meeting or major national/international meeting on optimization.

Audience:

The 2-day meeting is intended for faculty, grad students, and practioners. It has no registration fee, and is open to all students and faculty. Students at Univ. Washington will have the opportunity to meet and learn about current research from leading researchers as well meet students from other institutions.
