Objectives:

The Graduate Student Combinatorics Conference is run by and for graduate students, and typically takes place over a weekend, with participants arriving on Friday evening. On Saturday, and Sunday morning, there are two parallel tracks of 20 minute talks that are given by participants on a wide range of topics. Any student who wishes to speak is invited to do so, and some of the talks are expository accounts. The conference also includes a keynote speaker and banquet.

In 2006, there were 56 participants at the University of Wisconsin (http://www.math.wisc.edu/~gscc06/), and Doron Zeilberger delivered two keynote lectures. In 2005, there were 46 participants at the University of Minnesota (http://www.math.umn.edu/~drake/gscc.html), with keynote lectures by Richard Ehrenborg and Margaret Readdy.

This conference is a unique forum for combinatorics graduate students to come together, practice giving talks, learn about new topics, and get to know other graduate students in their field.

Graduate students in combinatorics are the intended audience.
