Objectives:

The Coast Combinatorics Conference involves graduate students and faculty in the region and beyond coming together for talks and discussions on topics of current research in discrete mathematics. In general this meeting has been an effective way to let researchers in the vicinity know what is going on, to provide an opportinuity for collaborators to get together, and to encourage new collaborations. (This is a Pacific Northwest Seminar by another name.)

The Coast Combinatorics Conference has been held annually since 2000, three times on each coast. On the west coast we have tried to encourage all participants in the conference to give a 30 minute talk.

Audience:

Faculty and graduate students in BC, Alberta and Wahington. People from elsewhere are most welcome. Graduate students are encouraged to give a talk.

We try to offer travel support so that students from outside of Victoria can attend.

Participants:

When held on the west coast, the conference has attracted from 30 to 65 people from universities in BC, Washington, Quebec, Nove Scotia and PEI.
