# Teaching and the Postdoc

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## What Teaching?

- ▶ Do some teaching if possible.
- Try to get at least one course that shows you can deal well with lower-level service teaching.
- If you have time, try to show some versatility.
- Teaching something you might teach in a tenure-track job will save you time later.
- Understand local norms and structures!
- Understand and respect the student populations you are dealing with.

## Getting Training

- ► Take a course or courses on teaching-related matters at your University.
- ► Look into current trends in undergraduate mathematics education.
- Consider short courses at eg MAA meetings.
- ▶ Learn to use available classroom management software.
- ► Think hard about posting material for students (what, what format).
- ▶ Get comfortable with various computing environments.

## What to Get from your Teaching Experience

- Use material for your Teaching Dossier (Good handouts, student projects with permission,...)
- Develop Teaching Dossier and Teaching Statement according to good models.
- ▶ Show that you can be responsibly innovative.
- ▶ Demonstrate the capacity to do teamwork.
- Win a Teaching Award?

## Managing Teaching and your Research Life

- ▶ Time management: plan carefully how long things will take.
- Be scrupulous about office hours.
- Learn to say no nicely (you have other responsibilities...)
- Seek assistance and advice.
- Don't assume that your teaching duties can be set aside, e.g. for conferences.
